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Executive Summary

- UVA Health continues to respond to the national IV fluid shortage as a result of Hurricane Helene's impact on manufacturing operations in Western North Carolina.

Nephrology


- Completed Decision Tree Design and submitted for HIT hand off

 Access and clinical team member training will kick off Nov. 11 to ensure readiness for staggered go-lives in December and January.






Wave 4b Progress & Upcoming Milestones & Waves 1 & 2 Optimization

- Groups also starting to look at other Decision Tree components and Diagnosis Matrices


Waves 1 & 2 Optimization


National IV Fluids Shortage Response Ongoing

 - All IV fluids in 250ml, 500ml, 1000ml, and 3000ml bags
 - Dialysis fluids
 - TPN components
 - Irrigation fluids
